Stringent Health Standards in Place:

- Stringent new health and safety protocols, including the Aruba Health & Happiness Code.
- Government-mandated procedures for visitors while staying in Aruba. These will be updated on a regular basis; the following are some of the most important.

Online Embarkation/Disembarkation Process:

- All Visitors will be required to complete the online Embarkation/Disembarkation card (ED card) process and be approved to enter Aruba. Requirements will include five components:
 - o Component 1: Basic travel information (DOB, Passport, length of stay, etc.)
 - Component 2: Personal Health Assessment (experiencing any symptoms, contact with COVID-19 positive individuals, etc.)
 - o Component 3: Negative COVID-19 PCR test. There are two options:

Option A – Take a COVID-19 Test prior to traveling to Aruba

You must take a COVID-19 test, obtained from a nasal/oral specimen through PCR testing performed by a certified lab and your results need to be uploaded as part of the ED card process. You will still be screened for symptoms upon arrival, including a temperature check. The cost of the test is the responsibility of the traveler.

Timing: You must take your test within 72 hours of traveling to Aruba and upload your results no later than 12 hours prior to departure. Testing prior to 72 hours will not be accepted.

Option B – Take a COVID-19 Test upon arrival to Aruba.

You can choose to be tested at the airport in Aruba. The cost is the travelers expense and must be paid in advance as part of the ED card process.

If you choose this option, you will be required to quarantine at your hotel for 24 hours, or until your results are back. We attempt to provide results within 6-8 hours where possible to minimize time in quarantine.

- Component 4: Requisite insurance coverage. Visitors must purchase Aruba Visitors Insurance. This is a mandatory insurance that helps protect visitors against incurred medical and not medical expenses if testing positive for COVID-19 during their stay in Aruba. This is part of the ED card process.
- Component 5: Consent to Aruba Government mandates. Comply with all of Aruba's health screening, tests and quarantines.

Arrival Health Procedures:

- All travelers will wear masks on flights to Aruba and while in Aruba airport.
- While masks are not required in Aruba, you are strongly encouraged to have mask on-hand when social distancing proves difficult.
- All travelers not showing test results prior to travel will be subject to test at airport.
- The test will have a mandatory quarantine up to 24 hours.
- All travelers showing negative test results will receive a temperature check and health interview upon arrival. If clear no further testing required. If tests are positive, the guest will remain in isolation, and traveling companions will be taken to a designated quarantine location.
